



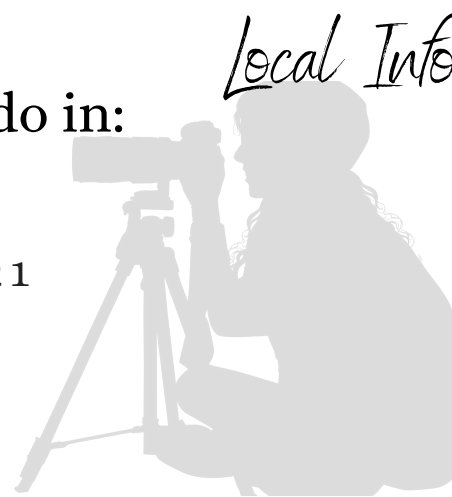

WALK AROUND GLENFALLOCH GARDENS

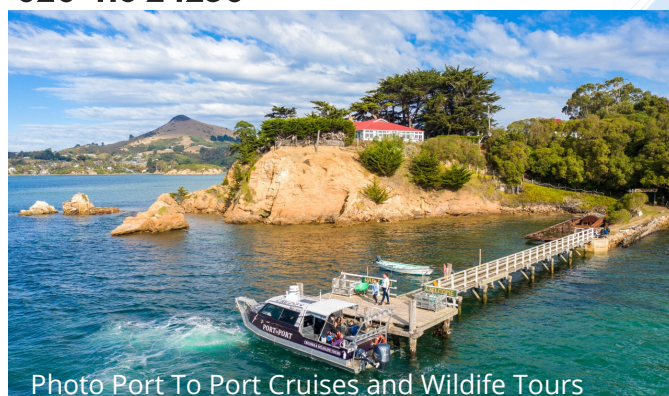

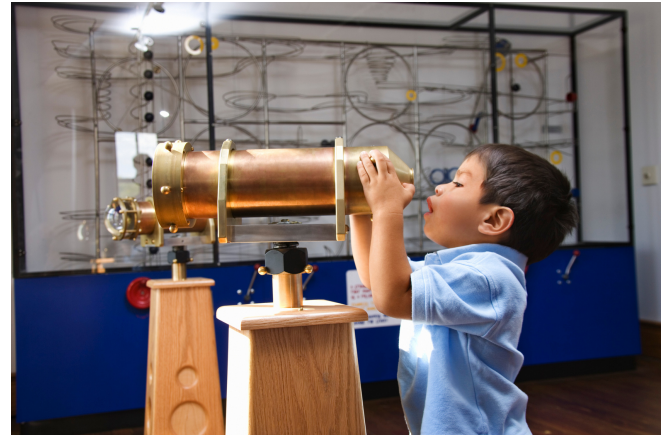
VISIT RESTAURANTS IN THE OCTAGON

1 DRIVE THE OTAGO PENINSULA



The not so hidden gem of Dunedin.

The Otago Peninsula is the number 1 thing you should not miss while visiting Dunedin!

No matter the weather these are always stunning and sweeping views. Drive Highcliff Road in one direction (low tide and no fog is best for views) and the low road the other way. Allow 90 minutes to get all the way to the end and back. And factor in a few hours extra to visit places along the way.
